A4 We always check about disability, access, and it does warn you about that, you know the walking. And you think about, you want to be prepared, it is upsetting.

A5 Just to make sure we could fit everything in, and know a bit more what to expect when we got there, and it is really confusing.

C4 We checked the tours, there's so many and we wanted to do Schindlers as well so trying to plan that in. We only had 4 days (in Krakow) and this is the second day.

D1 – because we were doing it independently we wanted to know about the layout a bit more and things we had missed, and didn't want to miss, so we looked at the website. And how to get there on our own, we didn't have a clue, so TripAdvisor for that. And you know tips about getting round, getting in early and so on.

What did you find out?

ALL - BASIC INFORMATION

A1 We didn't realise it would be free but we also didn't realise how far it is, so there's all the tour companies of course they charge different rates so it isn't really free as such. The Tripadvisor forum as well – top tips about the walking and the time, it is miles and we might not have known that. And some people mentioned the crowds, well you can't tell from the website or photos but it is just... we didn't realise, there was even a crush in the corridor parts. Then you're glad to get into the open space in a way, at Birkenau, but you're a bit lost at the same time. Because it's almost too big then, even with all the others, we knew there was a shuttle so it was separate but the size of it, again it's the reality. I mean that's why you come isn't it partly, this is it. This is how it was, and there was even more, it's too much to take in. But in a way I wish I'd looked at the website more, or got a book or something because some of it I feel like I'm not taking it in.

A2 You've almost, well you have got to go on a tour, you can't just come up and go in or whatever, it's all accompanied. So we had to take that on board, the cost of that and the planning for that. And it's quite, we checked the guidelines and so on, it's full on. And you've got to do a full day, so that meant saving the Schindler Museum and things for tomorrow, and it still isn't long enough you know.

A3 The size of it, and being in 2 parts, we got that off TripAdvisor more than the website because its very, its quite academic that, I mean a lot of information about the history but maybe not as much practical as TripAdvisor. But you still don't get it, the scale of it, until you get here and it's just... you couldn't realise it.

A4 The scale of it, which could put you off because of the mobility issues and, you know, going slow. So we got recommended, our tour company, it takes longer but they have the breaks and the small groups. We've seen massive groups in here going like hell, one lady is doing it in 2 hours because they have got the mines later, the same day that is. Which we couldn't have done. And that was from TripAdvisor really, but the website does come across as it's not great. If walking is a problem and so on. But you don't understand the size of it, even though I know we've missed out a lot here (Auschwitz 1), it's at the other site that you look at it and you think... it's like fields. The size of it. You can't, really, visualise it as it would have been. Obviously you can't, but as well it's just so many of us, groups, modern people you know. Coming and going. But on the website, you could go on forever. Photos and all the back story, and I'm glad we saw some of the photos and the stories about, just separate, the actual families and people.

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A5 It's a long way, you think it's nearer because it's top of the list of attractions but it's the whole day gone, you can't do much else without pushing it. There's a lot on the website about the background, the history, but you don't realise how busy it is for a museum. I mean it's actually too much really. I felt just, I don't know, zoned out after we'd done this (Auschwitz 1). And I could have done with a break really, I think everyone was the same. Then we got the bus and it's just another, knockout really, the scale of it. And we had free time to just walk around but it was hundreds of them. Of us. And we none of us knew where we were going, then there are signs but they don't guide you really. I don't know if there would have been a layout, I didn't see on the website, or an app. I don't know. Just exhausting.

A6 Nothing that really prepared me for it, it's not what I, I don't know what I imagined. More like a museum and some, layouts or buildings as they would have been. You recognise the parts, the gates and the trainlines and the tower and so on. But they are not together, they are in totally different places. It's not, all in one if you get me. I mean of course it was a camp, I realise now what that involved more, it's more complicated than you think.

C1 From the reviews I knew it would be busy and useful things like to take a drink, wearing these shoes – I've seen some ridiculous shoes today! But I feel sorry for some of the older ones, they are paying their respects but it's too much for a day trip, and the pace of it. So they should make that clearer really, or break it up more. There's nowhere to stop and sit down either, or you feel bad because it's disrespectful, on a wall or whatever. And the website I had a quick look but it isn't user friendly, but they give the impression it's more respectful than it is. Everyone's taking photos where you're not supposed to, which was in the rules, and some of the behaviour, it's just not on. Because pushing and shoving and things... because there's too many really, it was bedlam in the buildings. Which you wouldn't realise beforehand.

C2 We just got the basics. I mean we didn't go into the details, because that's what you come for, the experience of it. The reality.

C3 I realised it was going to be more of an undertaking, it's not like a museum visit where you see everything in one go. But I wish I had done more, because it's too much to take in. And there isn't time for questions or

You don't realise that you can do it yourself fairly easy, and quite cheap, I don't think they encourage it. But looking at the website to plan, a kind of route, a way round, we just couldn't get it. But the blocks, buildings, the different countries and themes, we realised that off the website and that's what we missed last time. And on the guided tour you get all the.. you know, to be honest, the tourist, the horror stuff. The ovens, the hair, the shooting wall. That's the plan they've all got and because we saw that last time we could avoid these crowds, there was hardly anyone in some of the exhibitions. We have taken our time because we didn't have to worry about missing out. You could spend a whole day here and then all over again at Birkenau. Which, the shuttle bus is for anyone, that's free.
