# #KnowTheSigns COUNTY LINES



County Lines is a way of distributing drugs across country, and often involves the criminal and sexual exploitation of children and vulnerable adults. Criminal exploitation involves forcing or coercing others to commit crimes, such as selling, storing, and transporting drugs, or assaulting others.

People who are being exploited may unintentionally facilitate the exploitation of others. Student accommodation may also be 'cuckooed': used as a secure location to store/sell drugs.

# #KnowTheSigns

- Students scared of or intimidated by particular people
- Increase in new visitors, particularly at unsociable hours
- General decline in physical and mental wellbeing
- Sudden increase of money, drugs, or luxury goods
- Students owning multiple mobile phones
- Students selling drugs to other students

#### Keep Safe

- Friends and flatmates have their back
- Be wary of accepting free drugs
- Don't buy what you can't afford
- If you are concerned, seek support
