

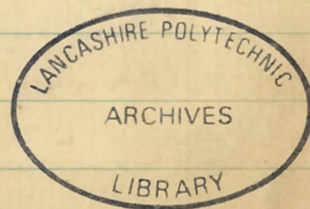

Jan'y 28/78. The Committee of the Lancaster Road Home Mission  
as nominated & elected by in Decr 1877 by the  
Church held their first Meeting in the  
Lecture Room on Monday evening, Jan'y 28/78.

Rev A Legg, Messrs Garratt, Jackson, Williamson  
& Harman & Misses Hague & Evans were present.  
The Pastor presided, and gave a brief sketch  
of the Mission from its establishment in  
September 1876 until the present time.

On the motion of the President which was  
seconded by Mr Williamson it was carried



X "That Mr Harman continue Secretary of the Society."

Mr Carratt then moved & Mrs Hagne seconded & resolved

X "That the organization and work of the Mission as was carried on including the renting of the Cottage in Rose Street be continued as before"

X "The Committee, in view of the necessity of funds being found previous to the time that the ladies working Society could arrange a sale, decided to request the Deacons to arrange for a Collection in the Chapel on an early occasion."

X Mr Williamson moved Mrs Evans seconded & resolved "That Collecting Boxes be provided so that each Class in the School could subscribe once a month towards the expenses of the Mission"

The Meeting was then dismissed.



April 4/78.

A Meeting of the Committee was held in the Lecture Room on Thursday evening April 4<sup>th</sup> when there were present Rev A Legge Messrs. Thorp, Garratt, Williamson & Harman, and Messrs Crook & Hague.

The Pastor, who presided stated that the Meeting was convened because that on his leaving the town it was necessary for someone to be appointed in his place to act as Superintendents & their representative to the Colportage Association and to receive and sign the reports of their Colporteurs.

Mr Garratt moved and Mr Thorp seconded & resolved "That Mr Hague be requested to fill the office of Superintendents to the Colporteurs."

The Chairman then stated that the Deacons had arranged for a Collection to be made in the Chapel sometime in May and it was then resolved



"That Messrs Thoop & Garrott endeavour to procure either of the Rev McFadyen, Rev Pearson or Paston Kirk to preach the sermons, arranging to see them during their visit to the Cong Union Meetings in Preston"

The Pastor opened & closed the Meetings with Prayer.

June 5/78. A Meeting of the Committee was held on Wednesday evening June 3/78. present Messrs Thoop, Williamson, & Mesdames Crook, Hazne & Miss Myerscough.

Mr Thoop presided.

It was resolved that 40 to 60 posters & 100 circulars be printed and that the advertising of Rev S Pearson's Sermons be left to the Secretary.

It was also resolved "That the Secretary give 3 months notice to the Metro Tabernacle Colportage Association that the services of Mr Thompson will not be required



after the end of the year, which expires  
Sept 6<sup>th</sup>.

It was announced that the Revd Pearson  
of Liverpool had consented to preach  
on behalf of the Society on Sunday  
June 23<sup>rd</sup> and that Collections of about  
£40 would be required by the Treasurer  
to cover the expenditure of the past year.  
(Signed) J Thoop Chairman.

June 16/78. A Meeting of the Committee was held in the  
Vestry on Sunday evening June 16<sup>th</sup> present  
Messrs Thoop Carrast Williamson & Harman  
when it was resolved that the Secretary  
recommend Mr Thompson for an appointment  
at Chipping. (Signed) J Thoop Chairman

Dec 4/78  
Minister's Vestry. A meeting of the Committee was held  
there, being present Mrs Crook, Hague  
Briggs, & Messrs Thoop, Hague Williamson,  
& Hecty.

Mr Thoop being voted to the Chair Mr  
Williamson opened with prayer.  
The Minutes of last Meeting were read



and approved.

X Mr Hagne moved & Mr Williamson seconded "that Mrs — be paid if per week for permitting services to be held in her house in Spring Gardens on Sunday evenings." — Carried.

X Mr Williamson moved & Mr Hagne seconded & carried "that the wall dividing the two rooms in the Mission Cottage in Rose St be removed & also that Gas be laid on"

X Mr Hagne moved & Mr Williamson seconded that previous to the Annual Church Meeting the Treasurer's a/c's be audited and that Messrs. Jewell & J. Crook be requested to do so.

X The following were nominated as members of the Committee for the ensuing year  
Messrs. Thorp, Garratt, Hagne, Crook  
Williamson, Davis & Harman, Mrs Crook  
Hagne, Briggs, Robinson, Evans <sup>Mrs M</sup>  
Myerscough.



x It was then decided to hold a Social Tea Meeting on Tuesday Dec 17 for those interested and engaged in the Mission work. Mrs Crook & Mrs Hague promising to make arrangements for the same.

Mr Boulton's Bill for advertising Rev L Pearson's sermons amounting to £1. 0 6 was passed.

A Meeting of the Committee was held at 7.30 pm. when Mr Thorp presided Mrs Crook Mrs Briggs, Mrs Hague, Miss Myerscough, Mr Carratt, Mr Williamson & Secretary were also present.

After some conversation as to whether there was much distress amongst the members of our own congregation & of the best means of dealing with any cases that should arise, Mr Harman moved Mr Carratt seconded



X resolved "That the four ladies present  
X from a Committee to whom all cases  
should be reported & who would make  
necessary enquiries & dispense what  
relief they thought necessary. The  
question of funds to stand over for the  
present.

It was then reported that about £50.  
would be handed over by the ladies  
work Committee as the proceeds of  
the Amas tree.

It was then voted that £10.0 be voted  
from the General Fund to the Preston  
Colportage Association.

was held, there being present Rev J Lambert,

were approved.



The Secretary then reported that as only 2 Members attended a former Meeting the accounts as follows were paid by the Treasurer

X Mr Harman moved & Mr Hague seconded that Rose St Temperance Meetings be placed on the Band of Hope Plan, this involving an Annual Subscription of 5/ to the Union caused.

The Meeting broke up after prayer by the Pastor.



Minister's A Committee Meeting was held at which

Aug 29/879. present Mr Mrs Hayne Messrs Williamson &  
Harman.

X Mr Williamson reported that the gentlemen  
selected at the invited Meeting of  
Committee Mission workers found that the  
Cottage hitherto used in Rose St could  
not easily be connected with the adjoining  
one so as to obtain more accommodation  
& in consequence he had been in treaty  
respecting a warehouse in Shepherd St  
formerly in the occupation of Mr Smalley &  
which seemed well adapted for Mission  
rooms.

X Mr Hayne moved & Mr Harman seconded &  
carried " That Messrs Thos Williamson  
see the landlord of the place and if he  
consents to make necessary alterations  
& repairs, the warehouse be taken for not  
more than 2 years at a Rental of 5/6  
per week & also should this be done  
that the place be registered for Public



Worship & that a notice board be put  
in a suitable place over the door.

It was also agreed that Mr Macfarlane's  
Bill of 3/6 be paid & also that further  
supplies of tracts be obtained.

On the motion of Mr Hague seconded by Miss Myerscough it was unanimously resolved "That it is desirable that the Superintendent of the Sunday School should be a member of Lancaster Road Church.

On the motion of Mr Harman & Mr Hague the following bills were passed for payment  
Mr Alston 3 weeks rent £1. 9. 0. Mr Rain for Gas fittings £2. 0. 0. Mr Williamson for Sundries £1. 0. 1. It was also resolved on the motion of Messrs Hague & Harman "That Mr Williamson be empowered to purchase 6 chairs for the use of Shepherd St Mission.

Mr Hoop closed the Meeting with prayer.

Mr Harman moved & Mr Carett seconded "that all necessary cleaning to the rooms be left in the hands of Mr Williamson to get done.

The Meeting was opened & closed with prayer.

Nov 7/80

On Wednesday evening previous to the service a Meeting of the Committee was held in the Lecture Room, there being present Rev J. Lambert, Mrs Cook, Mrs Hoag, Messrs Thorp, Williamson & Harman.

In the absence at first of the Pastor Mr Thorp presided.

It was reported that to obtain efficient cleaning & attention at the Mission Rooms, it was necessary to appoint a paid attendant, so that the fires could be lighted & the rooms cleaned whenever necessary, & it was then resolved that a suitable person be found at a cost not exceeding 2/6 per week: the appointment of the same to be left with Messrs Williamson & Harman.

The following a/cs were paid for payment  
Darlington for coal 9/2<sup>s</sup> Greenall for coal  
5/6. Williamson for sundries 10/0<sup>s</sup>

On Dec 30 & 31 1880. the Ladies of the  
Sewing Meeting held a sale of work for  
the benefit of the Home Mission with  
very great success. Such general  
interest was manifested that a large  
number of useful articles were presented  
for the sale. The sales amounted to  
\$83. 10. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  Subscriptions \$7. 10. 0 Total  
receipts \$91. 0. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ . Expenses \$6. 0. 0 $\frac{1}{2}$   
Net proceeds \$85. 0. 3.

This large amount was duly handed  
over to the Treasurer & places the finances  
of the Mission in a very satisfactory  
position. The Committee are very deeply  
indebted to the ladies for their  
generous & spontaneous assistance.

X The Supt after stating that the work of the Sunday School was very seriously impeded through the want of an efficient Secretary & of teachers generally. The Pastor promised to bring the matter before the Scholars of the Elder Class, & try to enlist some of them in the work, and also that & the question of track distribution be before the Congregation.

X Mr Jackson moved & Mr Williams for seconded & after some general conversation, it was resolved to discontinue the Evening School & to hold the preaching service at 7 instead of 8 o'clock, the change to begin at the new quarter in June & to be tried at any rate for the



Summer months.

The Meeting was closed by Prayer by  
Mr Williamson Senior + the Benediction by  
the Pastor.

regret that more helpers were not  
forthcoming, especially from our Church
