SUMMARY OF ANNUAL MEETING

The Ninety-first Annual Meeting of the Shepherd St. Mission was held at the Children's Home, Oxford Street, Preston, on Thursday, 26th October, 1967, at 3 o'clock.

The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Councillor E. W. Bunker, presided.

The Chairman of the Mission (Mr. S. T. Maxwell, F.C.A.) read the Committee's Report and also an Abstract of the Financial Statement.

It was proposed by the Rev. F. Wilson, that the Report together with the Financial Statement be (subject to audit) adopted, printed and circulated under the direction of the Committee and that the existing Committee, and other Hon. Officials, be re-elected en-bloc.

Mrs. M. Toulmin, J.P., seconded the motion and thanked the Mayor, Mayoress and Speaker for their attendance.

91st ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Mr. Mayor, Mayoress, Ladies and Gentlemen.

Some weeks ago a young girl was admitted into our care. Standing in the office, Mr. Smith asked her, "How old are you, my dear?" and at once the answer came with a child's naive directness, "I'm not old at all, sir, I'm quite new!" Surely that little girl was right. Born of a child's true instinct came the re-affirmation of an eternal truth, that every little child is a promise of life's renewal in variety and charm. But so many are still blighted on the threshold of life in this affluent society, and find they have no real home in which to live.

It is sad that in this present age, home, one of the most, precious words in our language has lost much of its fragrance. Today some homes are a little more than a place in which to eat and sleep, not a place where loved ones meet to enjoy the warmth and comfort a real home provides.

During the last twelve months we have taken twenty youngsters into our care. Out of a total of 275,969 children who have been helped in one way or another, 1,642 have stayed in the home for varying periods of time. In this same period we have been unable to admit twenty-five children, because the home was full at the time of their application.

It is, therefore, evident that there is still a growing need for such a home as this, and if we are to continue to meet this urgent need, we require all the help our friends and supporters can give. We would like to express our deep felt gratitude to the proprietors and editor of the *Lancashire Evening Post* for their Annual Christmas Appeal which this year amounted to £2,227. We also thank our many subscribers and friends for their continuous support without which we could not face the future with any feeling of confidence.

Our work is becoming increasingly difficult with each new admission, but as always, the secret of effective child care is revealed in the experience of child care workers, as no more and no less than real love and affection. We can always interpret this definition by analysis, and use Freudian terms

or Jungian language. Whatever the explanation and whatever the terms, in which we express it, it has been demonstrated repeatedly in our work, that a warm, secure and affectionate atmosphere can dissipate the most obdurate behaviour and problems in children. We have ample evidence that love alone opens the heart of a child to happiness. Conversely, we know what the absence of love can do in retarding a child, driving him from trust and natural interests, and in producing a cold, self-centred, perhaps thoroughly embittered character.

This fundamental truth, that both happiness and normality are the inevitable effects of a person being loved and wanted for their own sakes, is essential to normal growth, and this is the theme on which our home thrives.

Another growing problem we face, is that of suitable accommodation for our teenagers. Once these youngsters leave school and start work it is difficult to find good accommodation. Some of them still need supervision and the security of a home; others are more mature and are able to take their place in society, when accommodation is available. However, we feel that teenagers on leaving school should have alternative accommodation, and they should not of necessity have to take up residential work. This is a problem we need to solve, if we are to be of real help at a most important time in any youngsters life.

For some time now we have been giving serious consideration to the need for extending our work to include a hostel in which our young people could live when they leave school and start work. It would be impossible to use our capital for this purpose as it would involve such a great loss of income. The future of such a venture would be dependant upon an increase in our income.

One of our boys, who left school this summer, has been apprenticed as a painter and decorator. He seems to be settling down very well, and we wish him every success. A senior girl who completed her nursery training and then spent some time as a Nannie in Mere, Cheshire, has secured a residential post as a housemother with the Preston Children's Department.

This year we have continued to improve our home standards. In our last report we mentioned that our next important task was to modernize the kitchen. This work has been completed, being a great asset in the efficient working of the home. The bathrooms have been modernised with new baths, showers and wash basins, replacing the old units which have given good and useful service over the years. These improvements you will be able to see after this present meeting.

Birthday parties and outings have been held throughout the year, with visits to the circus and the fun fair. Our senior boys spent an exciting fortnight camping with the Boys Brigade in North Wales. The rest of our large family enjoyed a holiday at the Morecambe Bay Holiday Camp. The children also had a tour of the lakes, with tea at Windermere, and a sail on the lake. This outing proved to be one of the most interesting of the year.

Our sincere thanks are once more due to our Hon. Physician and our Hon. Dentist, who have throughout the year attended to the needs of our children. Our youngsters on the whole enjoy good health, and only infrequently have we had to call on their services.

The Preston Children's Department have also been ready to help and advise when the occasion has arisen. Our thanks are due especially to Mrs. Decker, for the time she spent with us when discussing the needs of our teenagers and their future accommodation.

It will be remembered that in 1963, Mr. T. A. Slater retired after 35 years as Secretary and Superintendent, and it was with great sorrow that we learnt of his death, after a short illness, on 30th April, 1967. We wished that he might have been spared longer, to enjoy the retirement he so richly deserved, and we extend to Mrs. Slater and family our sincere sympathy.

Our staff can look back on another successful, though a hard year's work, and we wish to thank Mr. and Mrs. Smith for their excellent service which has ensured the smooth running of the home. We are most fortunate in having with us Miss Traynor, Mrs. Hall, Miss Martin, Mrs. Jebb, Miss Morris and Miss Burch, all of whom are entirely devoted to the care of our children, and take this opportunity of expressing our appreciation.

MISSION HALL

I am pleased to report on some of the various activities which have taken place at the Mission under the leadership of Mr. Nixon and his faithful workers, whose aim and principles are to bring the way of life that was set down by the Founder 91 years ago, to those people who only attend Church for Christenings, Weddings and Funerals.

Mr. Nixon, who has been with us for 36 years, apart from his activities at the Mission, is also responsible for, keeping the books, the collection of subscriptions, organising house to house collections and our flag days, and in connection with this work he is probably one of the best known men in the district.

Next year he will be retiring and in preparation for this we have appointed his successor, Mr. L. Philips, who will work with Mr. Nixon for twelve months, during this time he will have the opportunity of meeting all our subscribers and supporters. We would like to take this opportunity of thanking all those who so willingly help us year after year in the onerous task of house to house collections and flag days.

The Annual Outing of the Women's Bright Hour Class to Kirkby Lonsdale and afterwards to Morecambe was a huge success, 54 members were entertained to tea by the Committee and an old friend of the Mission provided the transport.

One highlight of the year was the Christmas Treat when 65 poor children of Preston and District sat down to tea and afterwards were entertained by Mr. Roy Jemerson, conjuror, and Mr. Bridge who gave a cinematograph show. On going home each child received a present from Father Christmas.

We were honoured on this occasion by the presence of the Mayor and Mayoress and may I say, sir, that we look forward to you and the Mayoress coming on 16th December next to a similar event.

FINANCIAL REPORT

In presenting the Financial Report for the year ended 30th June, 1967, we have this year departed from the usual Receipts and Payments Account and in place have prepared an Income and Expenditure Account.

This change gives a truer picture of the year's workings as we are able to bring into Accounts items due but not received and liabilities not paid at the end of the year.

Last year mention was made of the expenditure, to be incurred on the alterations to the Kitchen quarters, and again as we all are fully aware the cost of the day to day running of the home still increases, and this year we have heavy expenditure on renewals.

The result of the year's working is an Excess of Expenditure over Income of £2,347, after charging exceptional expenditure on alterations and equipment of £1,182. This Excess of expenditure over Income has, due to the change in the form of the Accounts been reduced by Income received during the year of £1,579 which related to the period prior to 30th June, 1966, leaving a deficit of £768 which has been transferred to the Contingency Fund Account.

During the year we have re-organised our Investments, and whilst on the change over we lost £7,766, we have been able to re-invest in dated securities to increase our Income by £300 per annum, and on redemption date of the Investments will have recovered that loss plus a further £10,000' but this is some years distant.

At 30th June, 1967, the present securities were revalued which showed an appreciation of £2,018, and the Investments have now been divided into narrow and wider range to comply with the Trustees Act.

We have purchased a house this year for staff purposes.

During the year we received Legacies of £6,707, and the Contingency Fund stands at £62,830 as compared with £62,991 the previous year.

The Endowment and Contingency Funds amount to £68,480 which are represented by:

and the Land and Buildings of the Home and Mission as well as Furnishings and Equipment are not valued.

Whilst we had a large bank balance at 30th June, 1967, we had unpaid accounts of £3,647, and a further liability of £3,700 in respect of commitments entered into but not completed.

SHORT HISTORY OF THE HOME

- 1876 Mr. Williamson commenced the work by conducting Gospel Meetings in a cottage in Rose Street.
- 1879 An old handloom weaving shop was taken in Shepherd Street to accommodate 100 people, and enlarged the following year to provide for 50 more.
- 1889 The Committee bought four houses and a shop, premises of which had originally formed part of Dr. Shepherd's Library.
- 1892 Owing to a collapse of this newly acquired property, the present Mission Hall was built on the same site, giving accommodation in the main hall for 250 people.
- 1894 The Committee rented, and afterwards bought, three cottages in Laurel Street. One of these was used as a Shelter for men; the second as a Boys' Home, and the third as a home for the Superintendent. The need for rescuing boys and girls from an evil and harmful environment so pressed that in
- 1898 Two more houses were rented in Berry Street to accommodate boys, and, as from the beginning, women and girls were passed on to other Societies. The property in Laurel Street was pulled down and a Men's Shelter erected on the site, where a large cellar was used for wood chopping, which enabled the men to earn the price of lodging and food. Owing to the Great War this side of the work ceased in 1915.
- 1900 The Committee bought Crow Hill House, Oxford Street, where children of both sexes were accommodated; Mr. Williamson giving up his business to look after them.
- 1901 Twenty-five children were maintained there.
- 1906, 1926 and 1934. The Home was extended.
- 1950 To conform with modern standards, further extensions and alterations were carried out, and as advised by the Children's Branch of the Home Office, accommodation limited to 16 boys and 16 girls.
- 1962 This year saw a great step forward in the modernisation of our Home, which was divided into three separate family groups, two of twelve children and one of six, each with their own Housemother.
- This enables us to give our children a life more closely corresponding with that of children in their own homes. Shepherd Street Children's Home is not State-aided; it is run entirely by subscriptions and donations from a generous public. Our cost of living goes up just as yours does and we would be grateful for any help you may feel able to give. If you are interested in knowing more of the work we do, please come and see the Home—a warm welcome awaits you any time at 125 Oxford Street.

1,636 Children have passed through the Home; 84,500 children have attended our Annual Christmas morning Breakfast which was discontinued two years ago, and 275,969 needy children have been helped in one way or another.
