Mission

An excess of expenditure over income of £104, and the increase of the bank overdraft to £917, were reported at the 61st annual meeting of the Shepherd-street Mission and Children's Home, Preston, at the Town Hall, this afternoon. The Mayor (Councillor J. Harrison) presided, and paid tribute to the work of the institution.

The Chairman of the General Committee (Mr. W. A. Margerison) stated in the annual report that the income had, on the whole, been well maintained, but there had been expenditure of £97 on interior decoration coupled with the rise in commodity prices and provision for an increased number of children. There were now 43 children in the home.

Officers were re-elected, with the addition of Mr. W. H. Harris and the Rev. E. Porter to the committee.

Mr. A. Spencer and Mr. F. Messham, two other members of the committee, received button-holes. During the afternoon, visitors inspected the newly-decorated home. Attractions in the evening included a number of stalls, organised games on the lawn, and music by Barton's prize band.
