## Shepherd-street Mission's Work for Preston Children

"THIS mission has done a great deal for the town," said the Mayor of Preston (Councillor J. Harrison), presiding at the 61st annual meeting, in the Town Hall, yesterday, of the Shepherd-street Mission and Children's

Shepherd-street Mission and Children's Home. Preston.

The Mayor said he knew the founder, the late Mr. Joshua Williamson, and knew also of the exceilent work the institution had been doing for many years.

Presenting the annual report, Mr. W. A. Margerison, chairman of the General Committee, said that though general income compared favourably with previous years, it had fallen below expenditure by £104. Of this, £97 was in respect of interior decorations; other centributing causes were the continued rise in commodity prices, and an increased number of children for whom provision was made. The bank overdraft had been increased to £917, and they appealed for further help.

## FOR UNWANTED CHILDREN

The home existed primarily for unwanted and unfortunate children, and there were now 43 children in their care, ranging from five to 14 years of age.

As their charges left school, suitable employment was found for them, continued Mr. Margerison who read letters— received from children so placed—expressing appreciation of their surroundings.

"We share with you satisfaction in having been instrumental in removing these young people from harmful influences during their early years, and in preparing them for useful citizenship," Mr. Margerison said. "As far as possible we endeavour to give each child a normal home life with the training conductive to its best development.

He expressed thanks to the hon. physician (Dr. Thomas Harrison), the hon. dentist (Coun J. J. Ward), Mr. T. Fletcher, of Parkroad, Blackpool (who had again given them free use of his house at St. Annes for the children's summer holiday), the staff and boys of Preston Grammar School, the staff and scholars of Penwortham Congregational Sunday School, Leyland Congregational Church and Sunday School, St. James's Sunday School, Preston, and other helpers. The report also recorded indebtedness to the proprietors and Editor of "The Lancashire Daily Post," who for over 30 years had assisted their cause by an annual appeal at Christmas.
