Shepherd Street Mission

OVER 2,000 Preston poor kiddies will remember Christmas Day of this year when they have forgotten others; for in the morning they spent one of the happiest hours of their lives.

Shepherd-street Mission, Preston, which for years has been doing a wonderful service for the poor people of the town, again brightened Christmas morning for the children.

On Christmas Eve the mission workers sat up until late preparing the parcels for the kiddies, and the following morning they were at the mission shortly after dawn.

Each child was handed a breakfast bag by Father Christmas (Mr. John Kenyon, one of the mission workers), then they all received toys and Christmas cards.

ANOTHER LITTLE ARMY

Among those present were the Mayor and Mayoress (Councillor and Mrs. R. C. Handley) and Mr. W. A. Margerison (chairman of the committee).

After all the youngsters had received their gifts, along came another little army of poor kiddies—non-ticket holders—and these divided the remainder of the presents and bags among themselves.

On Christmas Eve Father Christmas came to the Mission home in Oxford-street, when the 46 kiddies there were asleep, and left toys for them all.

On Christmas Day all the children sat down to pork, and beef, plum pudding, mince pies and all the other good things of Christmastime, provided by the boys of Preston Grammar School.

In the afternoon the great annual party took place, when many old scholars visited the home and renewed old friendships. Father Christmas (this time Mr. John Wilson) was again in attendance, and he distributed toys to the children from a giant Christmas tree in the centre of the girls' hall.
