



Mature student and mum of three Kathleen Pomfret has recently been awarded the Tim Curtis/Partnership Award for the excellent progress she's made on the Foundation Diploma in Early Years course at Runshaw College.

Kathleen, 45, received a cheque for £150 and a certificate at a special ceremony at the University of Central Lancashire. The awards are presented to outstanding students at the University's partner colleges in memory of the late Tim Curtis, a former Deputy Director of the University, who pioneered access to higher education for those who may have missed out first time around.
