## GOOD INFLUENCE OF PRESTON HOME

PRESIDING at the annual meeting of Shepherd-street Mission and Children's Home, in the Town Hall, Preston, yesterday, the Mayor (Alderman W. E. Morris) stressed the need for continued support from the public.

The work, he said, must go on. Children were still being left destitute and must be cared for. It was only necessary to read the letters received by the Superintendent and Matron (Mr. and Mrs. Slater) to realise the value of the influence of the Home. It was indeed a home to the children and they looked upon it as such long after they had left.

In presenting his report on the year's work the Chairman (Mr. W. A. Margerison) said that this, the 64th annual report, bore witness not only to the high esteem in which the work was held by the public of Preston and district and beyond, but also to the generosity of the public.

Never during its long history had the work been carried on under such trying conditions as those now prevailing, but notwithstanding the war and its repercussions, affecting as they did the whole fabric of life, the income had been well maintained.

### RAID SHELTERS

Increasing prices, together with the additional cost of providing air raid shelters at the Children's Home, had increased the bank overdraft to £983. Despite this burden and the uncertainty of the future, he was confident that the work on behalf of the unwanted and neglected child would continue to receive the support it had always received. Legacies during the year had increased the endowment fund by £1,198 17s. 2d.

Mr. Margerison also paid tribute to the work of the late Detective Inspector Baines and to the generosity of the late Alderman J. Wade.

During the year 11 children had been admitted to the Home. Of
